Setbacks

The first issue is by the time we could get the supplies for the project to the barge and the barge to Grayling we would not have time to complete the project before first snow. The other problem is that Grayling still has quarantine for anyone that has not received the Covid-19 vaccine. The advantage for delaying the project until next spring is that we will have more time to plan and stage the project and the Covid-19 protocols will likely loosen.
