Staffing news

- Delivery news: Elijah Darrel DeVries joined the DeVries family on Nov. 20th, 2023. Welcome to the InterAct family as well.
- I continue following up with interested/potential future staff: (2 couples from Send North, 2 couples from Kingdom Air Corp)
- The Peterson children are all receiving the necessary educational and specialized services with a local school. We are unsure, at present, when they may be able to move back to Copper Center.
- Marcus (our long-term volunteer in maintenance) has completed his exploration time in Ruby intending to experience village ministry, and team cohesion, to determine the viability of Ruby for his future ministry.
- Jon and Maryanna Casey have approval from a lending source to build a house in the main part of Nulato. The Village leadership and the community are very pleased to offer a lot for them to build on. The Casey's have been offered a lot so they can build in the main part of town, which is a significant accomplishment in this particular village.
- There are 8 villages/urban areas that have requested InterAct to support their communities with missionaries; all have had InterAct missionaries in the past and are currently without leadership in the local churches. (see below)

 The critical need to address the invitations, from the villages that have requested missionary presence, is to find more mature staff that are specifically trained and supported to do the difficult work of cultural acquisition and target the core values and assumptions that drive the community's worldview.
