Project Evaluation August, 2011

Overview

Native Bible Centre exists to assist local Native churches by providing biblical resources that can be used to learn the Word of God. The T.R.I.B.E. program (Training Resources for Indigenous Bible Education) is designed to give general Bible knowledge along with practical ministry skills for the Native believer. Students have the option of taking courses for credit towards Certificates (upon completion of five and ten courses) or a Diploma (upon completion of 15 courses).

InterAct began this ministry over 20 years ago as a Bible training extension program when InterAct's residential Bible training program, Native Institute of Canada, was closed. The office of NBC has been located in Kamloops since it began. During the first years Area Bible Schools were taught on week-ends across western Canada as a complement to the extension courses. In 2003 Ed and Glenna Houston took over the leadership and administration of NBC with a vision to rebuild the ministry of NBC. Since that time new courses have been added and others have been revised.

In May of 2010, the production of the study books for Native Bible Center was moved to the Canada Field office. Since that time the NBC budget has operated in the black as course sales and donation income have covered NBC expenses. Starting in May 1, 2010 the sales and books produced were recorded in order to gain a better understanding of what is being produced and sold through this ministry.

The chart below outlines an evaluation of this ministry. The outputs and outcomes columns report on what has been accomplished while the impacts are forward looking to project where this ministry heading in the next 3-5 years. The total number of books sold and distributed for the year starting May 1, 2010 were 240. These were comprised mainly of six courses out of the 32 courses in current production. Five other courses sold approximately ten copies of each.

The ministry of Native Bible Center has contributed to the bigger picture of church development. More energy needs to be put into developing a comprehensive and culturally relevant leadership training process. At this stage of Native church development this cannot be done by a single agency or cultural group. InterAct, and NBC, need to be part of a bigger picture of partnership and facilitation among the Native believers and ministry agencies spread across Canada. This level of partnership will require intentional relationships and a willingness to let others take control of resources, like NBC, if that is seen as best for the bigger picture.
