Perspective

As we move into a new year, I am incredibly thankful for a solid team who share a passion for the indigenous people of Siberia. Yes, we are a small team, but God is working in some amazing ways in the ministry that He has placed each of us in.

During our team conference in October, we had a great discussion about reaching the towns and villages in Buryatia. We don't have a clear picture of what that will look like, but we have seen little doors open for Shawna that she has been looking forward to for many years. And with Frankie planning on serving long-term, we are thrilled at the opportunities that God may be opening for him.

People

<u>Shawna Hess</u> – Shawna continues to disciple women in Ulan-Ude. She has noticed a few people shifting perspectives on philosophies of how to reach Buryat villages effectively for the gospel.

<u>Lucas and Jamie Orner</u> – Discipleship remains the main focus of our ministry in Krasnoyarsk, all the while praying that God will use our disciplees to eventually go to unreached areas with the Good News.

<u>Ted and Kate Mole</u> – Ted continues his ministry in Alaska and is awaiting an update from the local believers about the next steps in the rehab center. He is considering a trip to Yakutia this year.

<u>Frankie Emrick</u> – Frankie has sensed God's confirmation about long-term ministry in Siberia. His plan is to transition to Ulan-Ude this summer, at which point he will likely be engaged to a local Buryat believer, Ira. He plans to continue as a volunteer for another year and then return to the U.S. to make the transition to full-time ministry.

<u>Teamless Missionaries</u>: Over the past six months we have had three missionary couples blindly reach out to us for support and advice. All three serve in western Russia and found us on InterAct's website. Along with practical, administrative questions, they mostly wanted to hear about a family that had been serving in Russia. None are currently interested in relocating to Siberia, but that won't keep us from praying!
